

What are Knowledge Organisers?

Teachers create knowledge organisers every term. They show the minimum, essential knowledge your child will be learning in Humanities and Science. The knowledge organisers often include diagrams, pictures, key vocabulary and key information.

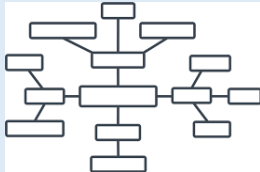
Why do we have Knowledge Organisers?

Knowledge organisers are used in class and at home so that children's knowledge is stored and retrieved over time. In class, knowledge organisers are on display on the classroom wall and stuck into the children's books. The children know where to find their knowledge organiser and they can refer to this during learning time.

It supports in many areas: retrieval of key facts, defining vocabulary, recapping knowledge, knowing how to spell key words and presenting key information in diagrams.

How can you use the Knowledge Organiser at home?

It would be great if the knowledge organiser was kept somewhere central. You could pop it up on the fridge or stick it on a wall! This will help your child to familiarise themselves with the knowledge.
