

#### Play your part in keeping the area outside our school safe

During last year a total of 149 vehicles received a fixed penalty charge for parking or stopping outside South Glos schools illegally, 28 of these were during Term 1. Park Legal will be making regular appearances with foot patrols and camera cars this academic year to help ensure our community stays safer for all traveling to and from school.

#### The Highway code states:

**Rule 238** 

You **MUST NOT** wait or park on yellow lines during the times of operation shown on nearby time plates (or zone entry signs if in a Controlled

Parking Zone) You **MUST NOT** wait or park, or stop to set down and pick up passengers, on school entrance markings when upright signs indicate a prohibition of stopping.

# **Barnabas Birthday Books**


### Celebrate your birthday by giving back to the library!
